#### **Pitchford Inquiry Terms of Reference**

- All undercover police operations by English and Welsh forces in England and Wales since 1968
- No other agencies operations covered in ToR
- Focus on SDS and NPOIU undercover ops in relation to political/justice campaigns. Will consider contribution of tactic, motivation for, scope and collateral impact of operations
- Will consider authorization and governance arrangements including awareness of HM Gov
- Will consider selection, training and management of UCs
- Will consider adequacy of legislation, policy and judicial regulation

### Key points

- The Inquiry is expected to last three years, witness cross examination to commence late 2016
- There are 156 agreed Core participants and number may increase however most of these are grouped into areas where sharing legal representation. The Commissioner, NPCC and NCA and core participants. A number of serving and former officers have been granted separate core participant status due to their concerns re conflict of interest with the MPS
- Legal representation re ex-officers is unclear (potential conflicts of interest). A number of the
  officers who have been granted separate core participant status are seeking for the MPS to fund
  their legal representation
- CC Creedon has suggested that National Undercover working group (NUWG) operate as 'clearing house' for requests from Inquiry to non-MPS forces. He and ACC John Boucher applying to NPCC for resourcing to create a small NUWG team to facilitate requests.
- All MPS contact with Pitchford Inquiry to go via AC- Public Inquiry team and DLS who form the Police and Legal Team, all disclosure will be recorded on CT Holmes. Address queries to DSU Neil Hutchison.

# **TOTAL POLICING**

- MPS will have 14 days to respond to disclosure requests, Inquiry Chair has final decision on PII and redaction of material
- Info Management is major challenge, 83 different digital and paper based archives of potential relevance. AC-PIT will need to task owning units to conduct searches and provide full disclosure.
- Units owning material will need to provide full, prompt and unredacted disclosure to AC-PIT team.
   This will involve prompt handing over of copies of Secret and highly sensitive material. Receipt notes will be provided and material handled to GPMS standards.
- Destruction of or willfully withholding relevant material from the Inquiry is a criminal offence.
   Business groups are advised to not destroy any material which could be relevant.
- MPS need to evidence contribution of UC policing to preventing/detecting crime
- Risk of internal impact on confidence of officers to volunteer as UCOs or leaders to use the tactic
- · Risk of undermining use of NCND policy with impact on wider covert policing/CHIS

#### **Risk to Confidence**

- Current public awareness very focused on sexual relations and police interference with legitimate left wing groups and justice campaigns. To a lesser extent; potential of miscarriages of justice, use of dead children's identities and 'blacklisting' of workers assessed as politically subversive by SB. This is reflected in the list of core participants
- · Other issues of concern include;
  - > Failure to reveal to courts undermining CJ system
  - Participation in crime
  - Failure to manage officers behaviour
  - Failure to manage officers welfare
  - > Involvement in other states
  - Involvement of other agencies
  - > Failure to implement legislation (RIPA)
  - Wider role of SB in relation to national security, monitoring of dissent/political groups and interference with democracy/free speech
  - Vulnerabilities in Information management preventing prompt and complete disclosure
  - Criticism of MPS lack of transparency if attempt to implement PII restrictions, NCND
