Hewlett Packard has identified that <u>some laptops supplied to the Met</u> between September 2010 and June 2012 have a faulty AC power cable that needs replacing. If you are a laptop user or use cables for power adapters provided with accessories such as docking stations, please carry out the following:

- Via the <u>power cable check</u>, see if the words/pictures describe the markings on your laptop or docking station power cable.

In December we advised staff of the recommendation from Management Board following their consideration of the Outline Business Case for Business Support Services. MOPAC have now agreed Management Board's recommendation to undertake due diligence with Shared Services Connected Limited (SSCL) and simultaneously to prepare for market testing via the Official Journal of the European Union (OJEU).
