
**ORDER PURSUANT TO THE RULING OF 2 MAY 2017 GRANTING AN
EXTENSION OF TIME FOR SERVICE OF ANONYMITY APPLICATIONS BY THE
METROPOLITAN POLICE SERVICE IN RESPECT OF THE SPECIAL
DEMONSTRATION SQUAD**

This is an interim order to make provision for the supply by the Metropolitan Police Service of a representative sample of applications for restriction orders in respect of the names of Special Demonstration Squad officers for consideration by the Chairman as soon as reasonably practicable at a rate manageable by the Inquiry. Applications for anonymity and any supporting evidence should be provided to the Inquiry in open and closed versions as set out in the process map referred to at paragraph 131 of the 2 May 2017 Ruling - <https://www.ucpi.org.uk/wp-content/uploads/2016/11/161107-process-map-restriction-orders.pdf>

It is so directed that:

1. As soon as reasonably practicable but by no later than 1 June 2017, the Metropolitan Police Service to provide to the Inquiry in respect of N7, N321, N323, N327, N329, N330, N333, N325, N345, N120, N326, N108, N16, N294, N343:
 - a. open and closed versions of applications for restriction orders and supporting Metropolitan Police Service evidence; or
 - b. written confirmation that no restrictions are sought; or
 - c. where an officer is separately represented then open and closed versions of the Metropolitan Police Service risk assessment shall be supplied.
2. As soon as reasonably practicable but by no later than 1 July 2017, the Metropolitan Police Service to provide to the Inquiry in respect of N146, N204, N335, N68, N58, N15, N81, N104, N123, N2, N297, N1251, N328, N26:

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- a. open and closed versions of applications for restriction orders and supporting Metropolitan Police Service evidence; or
 - b. written confirmation that no restrictions are sought; or
 - c. where an officer is separately represented then open and closed versions of the Metropolitan Police Service risk assessment shall be supplied.
3. As soon as reasonably practicable but no later than 1 August 2017, the Metropolitan Police Service to provide to the Inquiry in respect of N318, N336, N45, N241, N298, N322, N344, N86, N216, N23, N331, N334, N1, N347, N40, N348, N127, N78:
 - a. open and closed versions of applications for restriction orders and supporting Metropolitan Police Service evidence; or
 - b. written confirmation that no restrictions are sought; or
 - c. where an officer is separately represented then open and closed versions of the Metropolitan Police Service risk assessment shall be supplied.
4. As soon as reasonably practicable but no later than 1 September 2017, the Metropolitan Police Service to provide to the Inquiry in respect of N337, N338, N339, N341, N342, N129, N218, N301, N88, N72, N593, N56, N356, N33, N89, N17, N346, N24, N64, N109, N367, N332, N3093, N3095:
 - a. open and closed versions of applications for restriction orders and supporting Metropolitan Police Service evidence; or
 - b. written confirmation that no restrictions are sought; or
 - c. where an officer is separately represented then open and closed versions of the Metropolitan Police Service risk assessment shall be supplied.

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5. The Inquiry does not expect there to be any delay in the provision of the relevant documents in respect of these above listed officers given the care taken in allocating an officer to each tranche and the promise by the Metropolitan Police Service to ensure the appropriate resources are allocated to this work to achieve the dates set out above. If unforeseen delay does occur, then the Metropolitan Police Service must apply to the Inquiry for a variation of this direction as soon as possible and provide a full explanation as to why the date set will not be met, including the earliest new date by which the documents will be received.
