- 10 My last day with the Special Operations Squad was Sunday 27th October 1968, at the end of the last significant anti-Vietnam war protest at Grosvenor Square which took place on that day. Unlike the March event, there were sufficient numbers of police available and the US Embassy was not at risk of being invaded. On that day the VSC group to which I was attached went no further than Hyde Park and eventually dispersed. I then returned to the SOS office and resumed normal duties later that week.
- I do not believe that anyone could have been personally harmed, compromised or in any other way adversely affected by my deployment despite its inevitable secrecy and concomitant deception. I have yet to learn how discreet enquiries can be done in any other way.
- My activities during my extremely short SOS deployment were a straightforward public order matter.
- My deployment, as it was performed, did not bear the remotest similarity to the events which were the reason why this UCPI was set up in the first place and whilst acutely conscious of the fact that I have no choice in the matter I deeply resent having been forced to be part of it by being importuned 49 years after half-forgotten events in connection with a month's "attachment" to a legal anti-Vietnam war protest group which no longer exists.
