

N14 Jim Boyling - Additional Statement

I have been asked by the Inquiry to provide details of any violence and intimidation to which I have been subjected since I was confirmed as having been an undercover police officer.

I have brought three incidents to the notice of the Metropolitan Police which may be relevant.

In December 2010 an activist called Brian Healy approached me when I was waiting at the agreed location to collect my children for a day out (the [venue]). I cannot say if this was opportunistic or if he was waiting there for me. He was alone. I would describe this as personal harassment rather than intimidation. He backed off when my children turned up with their carers. It is difficult to harass a father with two children without losing the moral high ground.

In early 2011 I was confronted by an activist [PN0012] whilst working with a colleague in Brixton. *S/he* stood in front of me in the street whilst shouting at me. It was clear from *his/her* shouting that this was linked to me having been exposed as an undercover officer. *S/he* shouted things like 'we wondered if we would see you again'. Again, harassment rather than intimidation and I was not threatened.

In about 2012 (not sure of date) two cars parked outside my address had superglue poured into their locks together with some form of chemical. This is a classic activist tactic and seems to have been done by someone who came equipped in the early hours of the morning. My car was undamaged - I park it in

a different street as a precaution. Whilst no note was left I believe I was the probable target.

All the above were reported to the MPS at the time.

I have also had my work e-mail address published online (it had to be changed) and attempts to hack into my own account. Journalists have called at my home on several occasions as well as calling on my neighbours, my sister and mother (again, several times).
