

- 2. A risk assessment has been conducted by the MPS in relation to the risks to me and others in respect of the Inquiry's decision about whether a restriction order should be made.


 In August, I met with the risk assessor, and saw a draft of this document although my lawyers have not yet seen it. I agree with the contents of that assessment (subject to the minor amendments that I talked through) and support it.
- I am particularly concerned about my physical safety should my name be revealed, including the release of my cover name in light of the circumstances set out in this statement.





6.	I was already working in Special Branch when I was approached about the possibility of working in the SDS. Until I was approached, I did not know about the unit as it was very secret and nobody discussed the work that was done. It was very clear to me when joining that it was expected that I kept confidential the detail of the work that I did, my cover name, and that my identity would not be revealed. The whole set up of the unit led to this understanding including the meetings which were the only times you could talk with others in your position about the work that you were doing.

Apart from those who were assisting with my cover identity, no one was aware of my cover name, and apart from the limited detail that the close family referred to above knew, I have not revealed to anybody the work that I did. I have kept this confidential throughout and after the end of my career and expected that the Met would do the same.
14. I do not believe that my cover name has been compromised either during or subsequent to my deployment.
15. I am very proud of the work that I did and acted with integrity throughout my career. I believe that the work that I did had a significant positive impact and I did it knowing that it was not something I could boast about or reveal. As a consequence of the role, I have obviously had to lie to friends and family about the work that I have done (or at least not be able to tell them what I have done). I am worried that they will not understand the reasons for this and will see it as a betrayal which will affect both friendships and relationships with family. Had I believed that there was a risk of my identity becoming known, I would not have taken on the role.

If I was d to discuss any of the details of my deployment in public, this is likely to the revelation of my cover name Given I believe would be easily identifiable if any details were put in the public domain. I tand that the risk assessment supports the above concerns.

	d therefore ask that the Inquiry agree to restrict my real name and my cover and take steps to restrict my identity to ensure that I am not placed at risk. Given I believe the revelation that there was an undercover officer in

those groups would lead to my identification. If I am asked to give evidence in due course, I would ask that I be allowed to do so in private.
