

UNDERCOVER POLICING INQUIRY

Restriction Order Applications by HNI, HN3, HN8, HN9, HNI2, HNI9, HN20, HN27, HN60, HN72, HN353 and HN355

1. I have issued *Minded To* notes, dated 14 November 2017, 25 January 2018, 22 March 2018 and 26 April 2018, setting out the orders I am minded to make in relation to the **these 12 officers**. On 2 July 2018, the open applications and evidence relating to those applications was published. 'The Media'¹ and any core participant who wishes to take issue with these orders should submit written representations to the Inquiry by **4pm on 20 July 2018** setting out the grounds for the objection.
2. If written submissions are made the Inquiry will publish them, subject to any necessary restrictions.
3. If the Inquiry receives no written objection from core participants and no written submissions from the Media, the Chairman will issue a restriction order of which the terms will be disclosed in draft to the recognised legal representative of each applicant before it is made. The recognised legal representative may make representations about the terms of the order within two working days of receipt of the draft.
4. It should be noted that the Inquiry expects to publish on 9th July 2018 open applications and evidence where possible for officers whose applications I considered in *Minded To* notes 9 (published on 23 May 2018), 10 (published on 6 June 2018) and 11 (published on 21 June 2018). A direction inviting any similar written representations taking issue is likely to bear the same date for response of 20th July 2018.
