1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

2. "At a party organised by the NW London Stop the Seventy Four Committee held on Saturday 25 April 1970 at [Redacted] (separately reported) [Redacted] Privacy an active member of the Notting Hill Militants Association and a frequent attendee at extreme left-wing activities, was overheard to say that an attempt is to be made to abduct the South African Ambassador prior to the arrival of the South African Cricket Team.

3. He went on to say that observation had been kept on the Ambassador's address: [Redacted] Privacy Privacy [Redacted] Privacy; and the time of his daily departure and arrival and the nights he is likely to return late are known by a member of his organisation who lives nearby.

4. [Redacted] Privacy elaborated to the extent that even though they might not succeed in abducting the Ambassador at least an attempt would be made "following the example of the Guatemalan guerillas". He added that the sole reason for this action would be to achieve the cancellation of the forthcoming Cricket Tour. The Ambassador would only be released on a guarantee being given that the Tour would not take place, or would be abandoned, if the abduction took place after the arrival of the cricketers.

5. He was also overheard to say that it was known amongst his associates that there were no security guards attached to the Ambassador's household and that no uniform or Special Branch had been assigned to HIE's personal protection."
