As a result of information received I kept observation in the vicinity of the Regent Street Polytechnic, Regent Street, W.1. At 6.40 p.m. a group of four young men wearing Maoist badges arrived outside the Polytechnic where they were met by Albert MANCHANDA, who had been waiting there with five others. This group then went to the 'Phoenix' Public House, Margaret Street, W.1., where they stayed until 7.30 p.m., when they left to go to a meeting of the Revolutionary Socialist Students Federation which was held in the Polytechnic's Fyvie Hall.

While in the public house the group, which included two girls, discussed a draft resolution to be presented to the meeting condemning Soviet action in Czechoslovakia.
