SUBJECT Kilburn and Willenden V.S.C.

On Tuesday 17th. December 1968, at 8pm. I was present at the Community Centre, Tollgate Garage, Kilburn High Road, N.W.6, where a meeting of the Kilburn and Willenden Branch of the V.S.C. was due to take place. By 8.30pm. only three members and two delegates from Camden V.S.C. had arrived. As the heating in the room was defective, it was decided to hold a short discussion in a nearby public house.

The discussion centred on the proposed demonstration at Brent Town Hall on 21.1.1969 over the refusal by Brent Council to allow the Medical Aid for Vietnam Committee to use a Council clinic for blood donor sessions. From the points of view put forward, it is clear that a large number of persons will be present at this demonstration. Apart from the M.A.V.C. themselves, Hampstead V.C.L., Willenden V.C.L., Camden V.S.C. Kilburn and Willenden V.S.C. have all promised support, together with local tenants' associations, individuals from the Labour Party and Communist Party. It is confidently expected that unless the weather is adverse some 200 persons will be present.

An unidentified male from Willenden V.C.L. suggested that if police were effective in preventing a successful demonstration at the Town Hall, a search should be held to the home of Councillor V. SELAR 'a leading fascist' on the council. A symbolic gesture such as 'burning a U.S. flag on his front lawn' should be made. SELAR lives at [REDACTED]
