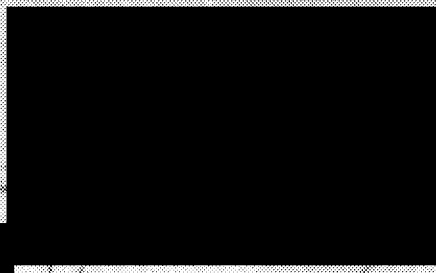
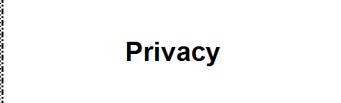

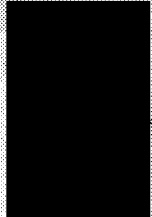

Date:

1. [Redacted] took up half of the meeting with his talk on 'Industrial Liberation'. He gave the history of the strike of the year '1960' and said that a liberal was the enemy of every true revolution. Liberation was something that had been invented by the establishment in order to keep the working class quiet. He made long quotations from the works of 'Marxism' and there were frequent interruptions from people who did not understand or did not agree with what he said. This was followed by a discussion on the points raised.

2. There followed a discussion on the success or otherwise of the General Council's tactics and the problem of several towns who were taking part in the rent strike. None of this was of particular interest to Special Branch.

3. Very noticeable by its absence was any discussion on the current Irish troubles.
