1. Submitted herewith is a photograph of Privacy taken en route to a Vietnam Solidarity Campaign meeting at the Conway Hall, Red Lion Square, WC2 on 22 September 1968. It is a good likeness.

2. Privacy lives at Privacy and is the full-time General Secretary of the Independent Labour Party, 197 Kings Cross Road, WC1. Despite his extreme left-wing views however, an informant states "he can in no way be regarded as a militant".

3. He first came to the notice of Special Branch on 10.10.67 as the author of an article in the "Socialist Leader" on Indian Peace Marches. Following that he regularly came to notice in connection with Indian affairs. On 18/19.5.67 he represented the Independent Labour Party at the AGM of the Movement for Colonial Freedom. Since that time he has been closely concerned with the affairs of the ILP.

4. Privacy has also attended Action Committee Against NATO meetings and activities extensively during 1969 but he left that Committee in October that year when its policy differed from the official line. He has also been connected with the Southern African Solidarity Committee, Free Palestine, British Council for Peace in Vietnam and the Vietnam Solidarity Campaign. He last came to notice on 2.3.70 when he opposed the nomination of Privacy as the proposed parliamentary candidate for Bethnal Green.

5. His description is:-

Aged about 30 years, height 5'7", brown eyes -wears spectacles, Privacy slim build.

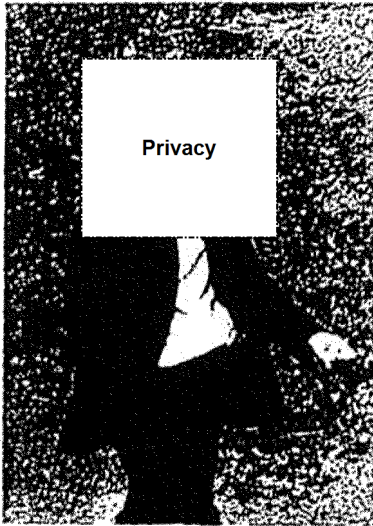

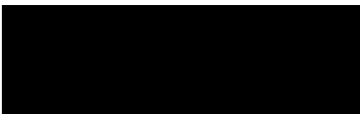
