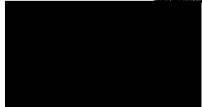

Anti-Apartheid Movement.

1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

"On Saturday, 6 November 1971, the Anti-apartheid Movement held a conference at the Central Collegiate Building, 15 Gordon Street, WC1, from 2 pm to 6 pm. There were some 40 persons present, the Chairman was Privacy

The aim of the conference was not to formulate policy nor take decisions for the Movement but simply to map out a strategy for implementing the A.A.M's campaigns and to achieve an understanding of the problems and potential of the Movement.

The conference was largely conducted in the form of four discussion groups as this ensured the sort of participation which was not possible in a public meeting.

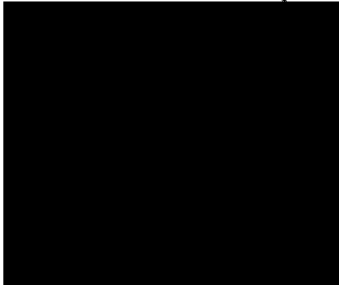
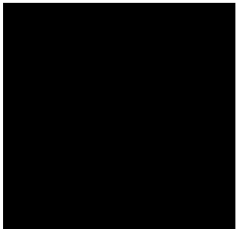
Privacy produced a discussion paper, (see attached) which raised a number of questions on the A.A.M's role. He then invited comments. Collectively, nothing constructive emerged from various members comments, only personal ideological views.

The discussion group chaired by Privacy dealt with "Publicity" and the action needed to increase the Movement's membership. Such an increase would provide the funds to regularly demonstrate and educate the average person in the street as to the meaning of "Apartheid", particularly in relation to South Africa.

The question was raised whether the Movement should financially support the various coloured 'liberation movements'. It was felt this support should be increased and fund raising considered, but it should not be allowed to jeopardise the Movement's limited funds.
