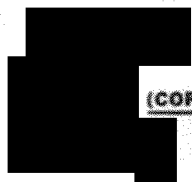

1. The following information has been received:-
2. "In the course of a private conversation at the 'Dolphin' public house, Bidborough Street, W.C.1, Privacy and Privacy who had earlier that evening collected money and correspondence belonging to the Irish Civil Rights Solidarity Campaign from the ex-treasurer Privacy said that Privacy who was very bitter against Gery LAWLESS and Privacy gave as his reason for resigning from I.C.R.S.C. as 'the fiddling' being carried on by both LAWLESS and Privacy. It seems that Privacy had gone on to explain that about two months ago hundreds of letters were sent out to all known supporters of the campaign asking for financial help. Replies and/or money were to be sent to Privacy. All correspondence for I.C.R.S.C. was being collected at that time from 6, Cotton Gardens, by LAWLESS and Privacy. When, a couple of weeks after the letters of appeal had been sent out, no money whatsoever was given to Privacy he suspected that something was amiss, and, to check on his suspicions, he had said to Privacy 'I understand from Gery (LAWLESS) that the appeal is going reasonably well' to which Privacy had replied 'Yes, even better than we expected'.
3. "From remarks made by both Privacy and Privacy it was obvious that they too don't trust LAWLESS with the handling of money, and have taken steps to ensure that money does not pass through his hands in future. In addition, Privacy expressed disgust at the manner in which Privacy carried out his duties as Treasurer. He had no receipts for monies paid out by him, and his financial records were in an appalling state which would take a lot of sorting out."
