1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

2. "A meeting of the Islington Branch of the I.C.R.S.C. was held at the 'George' public house, Liverpool Road, N.1. on Monday evening, 28th July, 1969 between 8 p.m. and 10.30 p.m. [redacted] addressed the members on the current situation in Ireland and urged all present, about 12 people, to prepare for a week of demonstrations to be held during the week commencing October 5th. Support was being asked for from the various trades unions, particularly the building workers, who were being exhorted to hold token strikes during this period. Employees at several large building firms had expressed their interest in this, including those engaged at the Barbican site.

3. In the absence of [redacted] the Chair was taken by [redacted] who after [redacted] had spoken, suggested that street meetings of the Islington Branch should be held every Saturday in Chapel Market, N.1. and that all branches should hold a joint meeting at Speakers' Corner on Sundays. Both these suggestions are to be put to the next meeting of the Steering Committee of I.C.R.S.C."
