1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

2. "The Islington Branch of the I.C.R.S.C. held a meeting at the George Public House, Liverpool Road, W.1 on Monday, 18th August, 1969, from 8.30 p.m. to 10 p.m. It was attended by some 30 people.

3. The speaker on this occasion was **Privacy** who outlined the history and activities of the Orange Order. The remainder of the time was spent in discussing what matters should be raised by the delegates to the next meeting of the Steering Committee of the I.C.R.S.C. on Tuesday, 19th August, 1969. The main proposal was made by **Privacy** that there should be a demonstration on Sunday, 24th August, 1969, and that the theme should be, 'Disband the B Specials', 'Disarm the R.U.C.' and 'Repeal the Special Powers Act'.

4. The regular Chairman, **Privacy** was not at the meeting as 'he had gone on his holidays to Derry'. (A phrase being used to denote that he is actively engaged with the civil rights organisation in Northern Ireland).

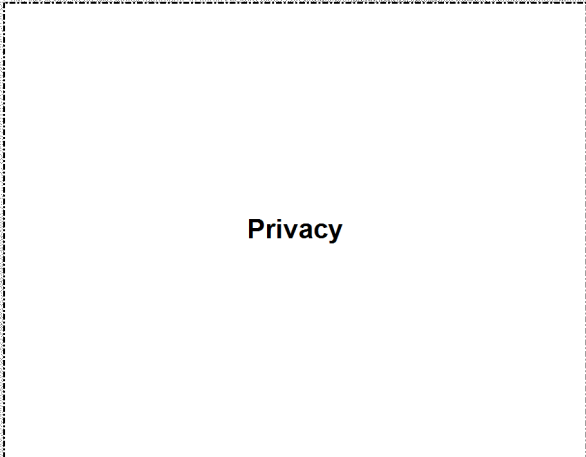
