"A meeting of the North London Red Circle was held at the 'Earl Russell' P.H., Pancras Road, N1, from 8.30 pm to 10 pm on Tuesday 22 June 1971. There were 15 persons present and the chairman was

The proceedings opened with a general discussion about "Black Power", but this did not reveal anything of particular interest.

The principal topic was a talk by Privacy on 'The Need of Women's Liberation in a Capitalist Society'. Her talk, however, was clearly ill-prepared and was poorly presented. She briefly gave the origins of Women's Liberation and stated the four main demands of the Socialist Women's Group:-

- (1) Free contraception on demand;
- (2) Free abortion on demand
- (3) Free 24 hour nurseries;
- (4) Equal pay.

She emphasised that the Socialist Women's Groups were concentrating their efforts on working-class women as opposed to middle class women, who were less oppressed. To that end they were working closely with unions and in particular they were attempting to form a union to assist women night cleaners in their struggle.

A few questions were asked but none was of interest.

It was announced that the next North London Red Circle meeting on 29.6.71 would be addressed by Privacy on Trade Unions.

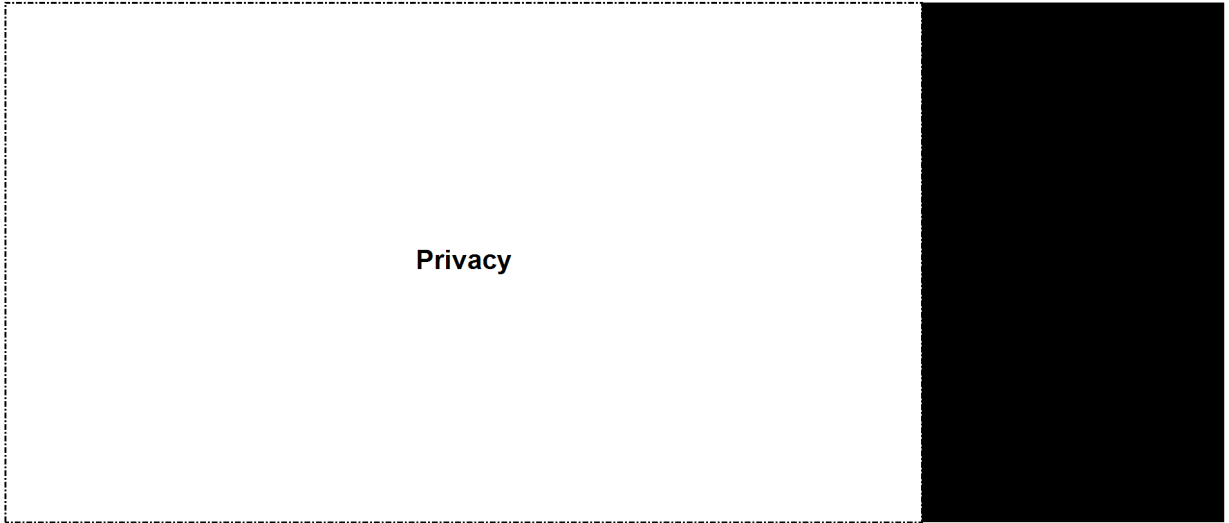
