1. The following information has been obtained from a reliable source:

2. "The International Socialists have decided to change the basic structure and administration of branches in the London area. They intend to set up a number of District Committees to replace the present system of co-ordinating committees and these will have the overall political and organisational leadership of the area.

3. The District Committees will work under, and be responsible to, the London Regional Committee and the National Committee. Their function will be to co-ordinate the work of branches in their area, give direction to the work of branches, decide on priorities, look for new areas of activity and to organise the building of branches in new areas.

4. District Committees will be composed of leading members from the branches; election being on the basis of one district member for every twenty branch members. All branches are entitled to at least one representative on the Committee. The District Committee will also co-opt an Industrial co-ordinator and a Education co-ordinator and these comrades will work under the supervision of the London Regional Committee Co-ordinators.

5. The grouping of branches into District Committees will be as follows:

NORTH LONDON

Tottenham Enfield,althamstow, Hackney and Hornsey.

EAST LONDON

Newham, Ilford, Tower Hamlets and Bessidon.

CENTRAL LONDON

Angel, Holborn, Paddington, and Camden.

WEST LONDON

Colindale, Harlesden, Kilburn and Watford.
