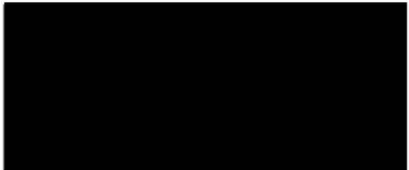

SUBJECT TOM

1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:
2. "The London Co-ordinating Committee of the Troops Out Movement met at Friends International Centre, Torrington Place, WC1 on Friday 19th September from 9.30pm until 10.15pm. About 32 persons attended the meeting which was chaired by Privacy.
3. The first item discussed was a proposal by both North and North West London branches of TOM that the number of persons on the organising committee be increased by two. This, and a proposal that Privacy and Rick GIBSON be elected to the committee, was passed. A three man standing orders committee for the National Delegates Conference, comprising Privacy, Privacy and probably Privacy, was approved. There followed ratification of branches in Harrow, Hemel Hempstead and Bootle.
4. Both the Free Speech on Ireland demonstration on October 5th and the November/December rally were discussed briefly. Privacy said that arrangements for the October event were going ahead as planned but that he was unsure of the support that it would attract. Privacy said that Friends Meeting House had been booked for the rally but added that the owners had insisted on a proviso that should the security situation in Britain deteriorate they could cancel the booking. Privacy said that this was unacceptable and he would therefore continue his search for an alternative site. The first Ad-Hoc committee meeting for the rally would take place at the Roebuck public house, Tottenham Court Road, W1, on Friday 26th September commencing at 7.30pm.
5. Privacy said that he had hired a 15 seater mini-bus to take people to the Labour Party Conference but had so far been unable to find a driver. He asked persons interested to contact him.
6. It was announced that TOM would support the British Withdrawal from Northern Ireland Campaign vigils outside the Northern Ireland Office and the Home Office on Saturday 27 September and the mass picket outside the Old Bailey on Monday 29 September 1975 (already reported).
7. The final and most sensitive item was a resolution from East London TOM suggesting that an all London meeting be held to discuss Privacy's resignation. After a lengthy debate, including contributions from Privacy and Gery LAWLESS, the resolution was narrowly defeated.
