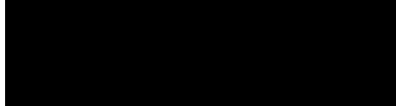

1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

2. "On Wednesday 30th July, 1980, between 8pm and 10pm, at Privacy (the home of Privacy Privacy) The Tottenham Branch of the Socialist Workers Party held a regular weekly business meeting. The chairperson for the evening was Privacy, the branch organiser and a member of the Lea Valley District Committee, and ten persons were present.

3. The first item on the agenda was a report from the District Committee held the previous evening and Colin CLARK, the Lea Valley District Treasurer and National Treasurer for the 1980 Right to Work March, explained to those present the instructions handed down from the Central Committee concerning future perspectives. In short this concerned the Right to Work Campaign and the proposed picket of the 'Tory' Party Conference in Brighton on 10th October, 1980.

4. In respect of the Right to Work Campaign and the directly linked 1980 Right to Work March, it was essential that all members of the Branch increase their efforts to secure donations and sponsorships for the march from South Wales to Brighton. In addition to this it would become necessary to visit all members, past and lapsed comrades and the entire local periphery to build a mass of workers who would be willing to attend the picket of the 'Tory' Party Conference in Brighton on Friday 10th October, 1980 - this being the culmination of the effort put into the 1980 Right to Work March and considered by the Central Committee as being the prime method of gaining the support of the working and labour movement in removing the 'Thatcher Government' from power.

5. The meeting concluded with Privacy, the Lea Valley District Secretary, giving a short talk on 'The demise of the German Communist Party at the hands of the Social Democratic Party in that country between the two world wars'."

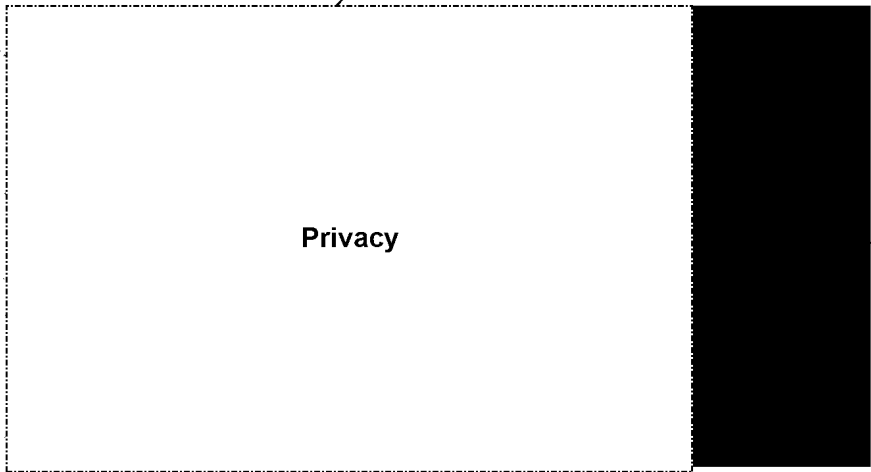
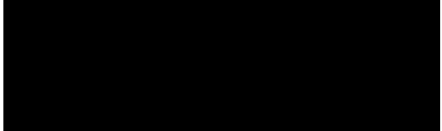
