Privacy

1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

Privacy

2. A meeting was held on Wednesday 19th March 1975 of the Kingston Branch of Anarolist Workers Association. The meeting, which began at 7.30 pm and ended at 10.30 pm, was attended by six persons.

Privacy

3. Privacy opened the meeting by introducing the owner of the house where the meeting was held at Privacy, and his girl friend

Privacy, both whose people were members of Libertarian Communism but were requesting dual membership of the two organisations (Libertarian and AWA). The matter was not popular with the other members and so Privacy said he would speak to them after the meeting. The minutes of the previous meeting were then read and passed.

4. Privacy then referred to a IPIS meeting that he had attended and showed a leaflet obtained, issued by Campaign Against Criminal Trespass Law. Then ensued a discussion about the Criminal Trespass Law, and in particular, how it affected the AWA policy of workers' control of factories. It was decided to support the campaign and more literature would be obtained.

5. Privacy then referred to a meeting he had attended of Centro Iberico, on the subject of the National Health Service. He said there was a lot of rubbish spoken at the meeting and he did not consider the organisation worth supporting. The next point was 'job reviews'. Privacy said that he was hoping to get a job soon through Privacy of Claimants Union; but nothing else of interest was raised. The discussion then turned to forthcoming events. It was decided to support the Anti-Apartheid demonstration on 23rd March and the Anti-Fascist Rally on 25th March, in Islington, although not as a group.

6. 'Libertarian Struggle' copy date was announced as being 5th April and various members prof'ered contributions. The AWA National Conference was announced as being 3rd/4th May and it was decided that Privacy would attend. The two Libertarian Communist members said they would like to attend as observers, a point which Privacy said he would consider. No other points of interest were
