1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

2. "There is some disquiet amongst those persons arrested during the Anti-Internment League Demonstration held on 5 February 1972, as the 'Defence Fund' which was set up has yet to give assistance. Instead, it is said the fund is providing Privacy with £25 per week.

3. In addition Privacy is being held in contempt for the way in which he handled the parade. It is beyond the comprehension of many people why he was not arrested for conspiracy along with Privacy as it is generally accepted it was he who made the statement relinquishing control of the demonstration and not Privacy

4. There has also been a suggestion that when the 'March 26' demonstration arrives at Trafalgar Square the organisers and stewards will relinquish control and it is hoped that the participants will then rampage down Whitehall and the surrounding area, smashing windows, etc."
