1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

2. "A Marxist class was held from 7.30 pm to 11 pm on Tuesday, 30 April 1974 at Privacy, the address of Privacy. It consisted of the 11 persons present reading in turn paragraphs from the first chapter of Marx and Engel's 'Communist Manifesto'. Although ~~several~~ present took part in the ensuing discussion, Privacy and Privacy (a forty year old, tanned, bald headed man from Blackheath) emerged as the leading participants. As a result the three often over-elaborated and went off at irrelevant tangents.

3. Privacy, during the course of his numerous interventions, stated that when the socialist revolution took place some two million people in this country would have to be liquidated, because they could never be converted to the cause of the revolution and would present a permanent threat to its continuance. He counted among these people such groups as senior police officers - especially those in Special Branch, members of the Security Service, senior army officers, big businessmen and all leading members of the Conservative Party.

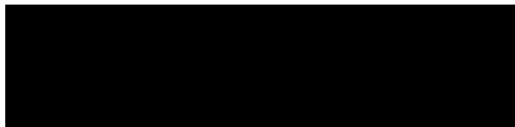

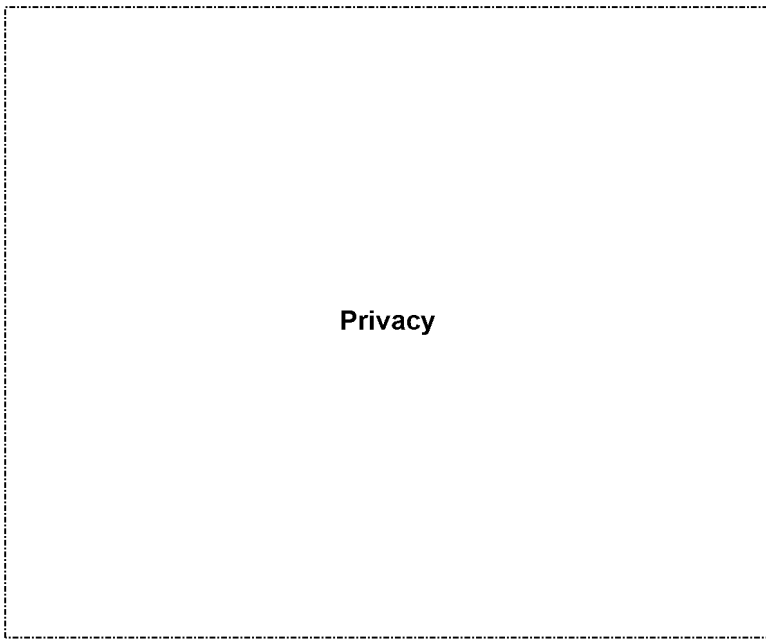
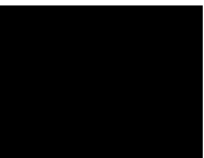
