1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

2. "On Thursday 23 October 1975, between 8 pm and 10 pm a closed branch meeting of Paddington International Socialists was held at the home of [REDACTED] a former secretary of the branch. Twelve persons were present.

3. The agenda, consisting mainly of business matters, was diverted to discussion on forthcoming events relative to Paddington IS. Amongst those points discussed was the National Front's proposed march on 9 November 1975. It was learned that the Inner West London District of IS had submitted a "strongly-worded letter" to the Central Committee criticising the organisation of the recent march on Chelsea Town Hall.

4. No definite plans were made for a counter-demonstration on 9 November 1975, but the subject will probably be raised again. Other events which were discussed were the Womens Day School to be held on 16 November 1975 at 10 am at the Workers Music Association, Westbourne Park Road and the "Womens Voice" conference to be held on 29 November 1975 at Belle Vue, Manchester. The latter meeting is open to women only.

5. The branch pledged support for the National Abortion Campaign meeting on 25 October 1975 at The Crown, Cricklewood, and 2 members will attend.

6. Little else of interest to Special Branch was discussed and the meeting closed at 10 pm with members adjourning to a local public house.
