1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

2. A meeting was held by the Wandsworth Group of the Anarchist Workers Association on Thursday 23 October 1975. The meeting, which was attended by eleven persons, began at 7.30pm and ended at 11pm.

3. Privacy was elected chairperson. The first items discussed, which were of no particular interest to Special Branch, concerned the sales and distribution of Libertarian Struggle.

4. It was after these discussions that Privacy suddenly arrived with his girl friend, Privacy. He asked for an urgent discussion on the impending collapse of the Kingston Group, owing to the departure of a few members to new addresses. Privacy was now living with his parents in Wallington; Privacy was moving to a squat in the Battersea area; and Privacy himself, after falling out with his flat-mate Privacy, was looking for accommodation in the Hildisak area.

5. Privacy and Privacy were accepted as members of the Wandsworth Group, and it was decided that the Kingston Group membership crisis would be discussed at a later date.

6. After Jim PICKFORD had reported on the Delegates Conference held in Wandsworth on 18 October, which he had attended as an observer, certain appointments were made. Privacy as a delegate to act on 'Womens Issues', and Privacy as a delegate on the Editorial Board for the next issue of Libertarian Struggle.

7. The decision by Privacy, member of the Leicester Group and National Executive, to join the IMG, was the last item discussed. Privacy reported that the London group had decided to call an emergency Conference to be held at Wandsworth on 8 November, to which both Privacy and a member of the Leicester Group would attend.



8. The Organisation of Revolutionary Anarchists would be holding an International Conference in Paris from 8 November to 11 November, and [Privacy] of the East London Group, was elected to attend on behalf of the ORA. The ORA had also asked for volunteers to join with the Basque Separatists and march into Spain sometime in November. The request was rejected through lack of volunteers.

9. The last item of business was the acceptance of [Privacy] as a candidate member of O.R.A.
