1. The following information has been received from a reliable source: Privacy Privacy

2. The Hammersmith Branch of the International Socialists held its regular weekly meeting on Thursday 6 May 1976, from 8 pm to 9.30 pm at Privacy, Privacy and Pete CANNELL. The chairman was PAVIER and seven persons were present.

3. The first issue discussed was the present construction of the Branch. As a result of Privacy having been elected secretary of the Inner West London District Committee of IS a new Branch secretary had to be elected. In spite of much pressure from other members the treasurer, Geoff WALLACE, refused the job and Pete CANNELL, who had recently transferred from the Imperial College Branch of IS, was elected to fill the vacancy.

4. PAVIER then informed the meeting of the proposed plans for a picket of Hendon Magistrates' Court when the 44 persons arrested on the Manchester to London 'Right to Work' march appeared on May 21 1976. He stated that the picket would start at 9.30 am and last until 12 noon. Comrades would then march to the Classic cinema, Hendon, for a rally from 1 pm until 2 pm.

5. It was announced that the 'Save Acton Hospital' campaign would picket a local area health authority meeting, called to discuss the future of the hospital, at its headquarters in Bath Road, Hounslow on 16 June 1976. The Campaign also proposed to hold a demonstration in Acton on July 17th 1976, but no further details were given.*
