1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

2. "A meeting was held by the Federation of London Anarchist Groups (FLAG) on Saturday, 3 July, 1976, at Freedom Bookshop, High Street, E1. The meeting, which was attended by 10 persons, began at 10.30 am and concluded at 1.30 pm. [Privacy] acted as chairperson.

3. The subject of a public meeting on the 'Fight to Live' campaign, proposed for September, was discussed and as nobody had been in touch with either the Claimants Union or Big Flame, as was originally agreed, it was decided that the meeting should be entitled just 'The Fight to Live'. To this end Jim PICKFORD was to contact CACTL and CU to see if speakers could be arranged.

4. The item of discussion which took most of the time was the proposed campaign against the hanging of the two Irish anarchists, Noel and Marie MURRAY. [Privacy] had just returned from Dublin where he had been in contact with campaign organisers, who wanted to know what was being done in London and he had had to report that next to nothing was being done. He suggested that a committee be set up to arrange for future events and that all letters written should be carbon copied to send to the campaign in Ireland. He stated that the organiser there was

5. [Privacy] then said that a picket in Kilburn the previous Saturday had been a disaster, in as much as only eight persons had turned up and he had abandoned it. [Privacy] argued that to hold a picket outside a bank, albeit that it was in an Irish community, was a waste and suggested a lunch-time picket to be held outside the Irish Embassy every Monday until the date given for the execution. It was finally agreed that all members should endeavour to find out what response this would get from their own contacts and that a further meeting with the contacts would be held at Centro Iberico on Thursday 8 July. The Troops Out Movement was also to be approached in an attempt to obtain support.
