2. "On Wednesday, 28 July 1976, between 6pm and 9pm at 23, Holden House, Deptford Church Street, S.E.8, a regular business meeting was held of the South East London area I.M.G., attended by six persons.

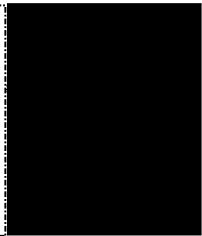

3. With the early departure of Privacy and Privacy to attend a meeting of the local T.O.M., the main business of the evening was a discussion of the intervention by Privacy and Privacy in the Greenwich Labour Party. Privacy had expressed doubts about the revolutionary validity of his work in the Party, facing the dichotomy of being easily able to build the local L.P.Y.S. and yet holding no illusion in the ability of the Labour Party to bring about socialism in this country. Privacy in a lengthy polemic which reiterated all the I.M.G. slogans about the Trotskyist orientation to the Labour Movement, assured him that his main aim should not be to build the size of the L.P.Y.S. but seek to raise the class consciousness of those already in that body and seek to woo them to revolutionary politics in general and the I.M.G. in particular. It was further declared that the I.M.G. had not sufficiently prepared those members and contacts intervening in the Labour Party so as clearly to defuse their perspectives."
