1. The following information has been received from a secret and reliable source:-

2. A meeting was held on Thursday, 30 January 1975 by Freedom Collective at 81B Whitechapel High Street, E1. The meeting, which was attended by eight persons, commenced at 7 pm and ended at 9 pm.

3. The meeting was opened by Privacy who once again apologised for the absence of Privacy. He then suggested as a possible topic of conversation, a book due to be published soon, written by Privacy. This idea was not favourably received, especially by Privacy, who said that he was of the opinion that Freedom, despite being known as the heart of anarchy in this country, seemed to be fast becoming a tradition as opposed to an anarchist group.

4. Privacy then asked for discussion on the current leadership crisis in the Conservative Party. This met with much better response. Privacy then continued by pointing out the possibility of Margaret Thatcher becoming the leader of the party and Sir Keith Joseph, Home Secretary. Privacy pointed out that such appointments would certainly make the working class rise up and that the revolution might then begin."
