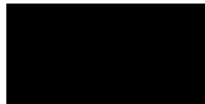

1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:

2. On Thursday 26 February 1976, between 6.30 pm and 9 pm, at 23 Golden Square, Deptford Church Street, SE8, a regular business meeting was held of the South-East London International Marxist Group. Three persons were present.

3. [Privacy] announced that [Privacy] would not now be visiting South-East London during the week commencing Monday 1 March because of the sudden death from influenza of an IND comrade called [Privacy] in Sheffield. Following a short discussion it was agreed that [Privacy] and [Privacy] delegates to the Greenham Common Women's Trade Councils respectively, should seek to place notices at the next meeting of those bodies calling for a large public conference in South-East London to campaign against cuts in public expenditure. The remainder of the evening's business was concerned with planning the fund-raising social evening at the above address on Saturday 28 February.

4. It was learned in informal discussion after the meeting that the brother of [Privacy] called [Privacy] and his wife [Privacy], both sympathisers of the IND, were to undertake entry work into the Labour Party in South-East London on behalf of the IND.
