1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:

2. "About three years ago, Paddington Branch of the International Socialists was the largest branch of the West London area. Now a branch within the Inner West London District of IS, Paddington has an effective membership of only four members. The following is a list of personalities involved in the decline of the Branch:

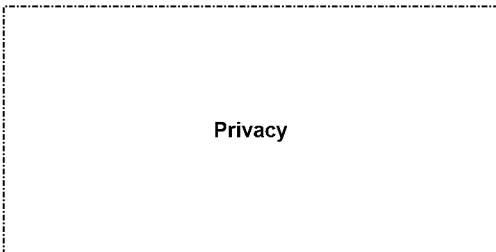
