"On Wednesday 18 June 1975 between 8 pm and 10.15 pm in a private room at the Queen's Arms public house, Burrage Road, SE18, a regular weekly aggregate meeting was held of the South-East London members of the International Marxist Group. Eight persons attended, including the full-time London organiser,

3. Privacy opened the meeting by reading details from the 'Notes to Organisers' concerning arrangements for the National Abortion Campaign demonstration on Saturday 21 June 1975. The main part of the evening was then occupied with a discussion of the area's perspectives of political work over the coming period. It was for this reason that Privacy was in attendance, because in recent months the area has gained a reputation for lack of organization and agitation. He felt that the proper perspective, in view of the lack of support in the district, would be to concentrate on a maximum of three aspects of work. Privacy insisted that one of these should include activity amongst students at Thames Polytechnic and she then demanded that this perspective be properly discussed. It was agreed that a full discussion on priorities should take place at the next meeting, when all those interested in the question of 'prioritisation' should present documents.

4. The meeting concluded with Privacy delivering a lengthy 'educational' talk on the Labour Party, in which no one was interested."

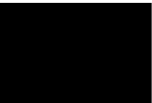

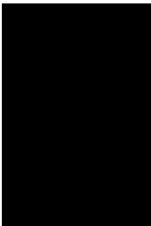
