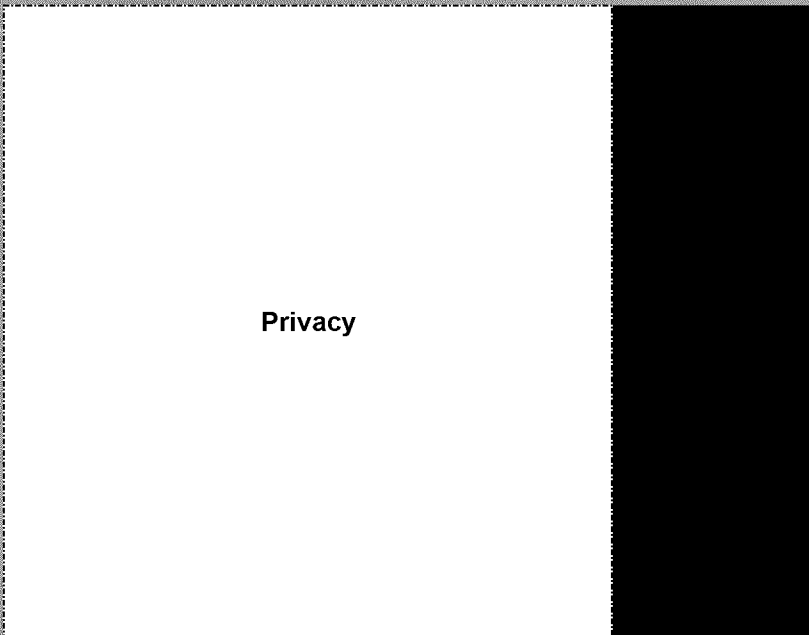
SUBJECT

1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:

2. "On Thursday 6th March 1980 at 8 pm, at the Trades and Labour Club, Dalston Lane, E8, the Stoke Newington Branch of the SWP held one of its regular weekly meetings.

3. The topic for discussion was the 'steel strike', and the meeting was chaired by [Privacy]. The first speaker was a steel worker from Stocksbridge, near Sheffield, who spoke about the problem of financing the strike and explained that he, together with other steel workers, had travelled the country attempting to raise funds for the strike. The second speaker was [Privacy], a member of the Central Committee of the SWP, who spoke enthusiastically about the struggle of the steel workers stating that he was encouraged how the steel workers had become politicized through the struggle and thus realised the worth of true socialist politics."
