SUBJECT

1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

2. [Privacy], a founding member of the Revolutionary Marxist Tendency has been suspended sine die from that organisation for misappropriating party funds to the amount of £60.

3. Although it has not been admitted by [Privacy], there is a strong suspicion that he spent the money on a girl, believed to be a prostitute, whom he met late one night on Clapham Common. Certainly [Privacy] has a physical deformity, has often shown signs of being obsessed with the thought of women and his general character would make this suspicion perfectly credible.

4. Where [Privacy] will go, politically, is questionable. He has previously approached and been rejected by the Spartacist League, Workers Socialist League, and Workers Party, while he is too theoretically developed to be tolerated by a group such as the Socialist Workers Party. His rejection by those groups apparently arose because they considered he had not sufficiently broken from the policies and practices of the Workers Revolutionary Party."
