1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

2. On Friday 6 May 1977, between 5.30pm and 8pm, a meeting of the North London Branch of the International Communist League was held at 115 Collington Park, Eps. Seven persons were present.

1. The subject of the meeting was the failure of Labour Party candidates to secure seats in the local elections on the previous day.

2. It was felt that the Conservative victories and the rise in support for the National Front were as a direct result of the Labour Party's failure to forge ahead with the 'socialist' aspects of its manifesto.

3. [Redacted] Privacy said that the clear duty of the ICL was to push for more members to join local Labour Party Young Socialist branches in an attempt to force the Labour Party further left.

4. The increased return for the National Front was seen as a clear indication of the polarization of views in the face of the continuing capitalist crisis. [Redacted] Privacy said that more must be done to oppose the National Front and all of that organization's activities, from street paper sales to demonstrations, should be countered by the ICL.

5. The meeting closed with a collection for the selling 'Workers Action' newspaper.

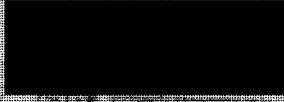
