1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

2. A meeting was held of the Kingston Branch of the Anarchist Workers Association on Wednesday 12 March 1975 at 16 St Leonards Road, Surbiton, Surrey. The meeting, which was attended by five members, started at 7.30 pm and finished at 10 pm.

3. The proceedings were opened by [Privacy] who began by reading out correspondence received. The only letter of interest was from a [Privacy] of [Privacy] Hill, who had made an application to join the organisation. It was decided that a letter should be sent to [Privacy] to arrange for somebody to call on him and interview him.

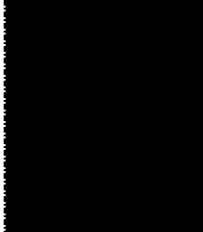
4. [Privacy] then outlined his Union activities, including the fact that he would be a representative at the Union Conference at Eastbourne in May. [Privacy] informed the others present that he was known to Special Branch and some years ago had been questioned by them following the disappearance of the Ugandan High Commissioner's daughter, with whom he had been on friendly terms. He said that he was in possession of internal papers of the Birmingham International Marxist Group, which had been left at his flat after the recent bomb attacks in Birmingham, and offered to produce them at the next meeting. It was agreed that he would be left to glean any useful information from the papers and to supply details at a later date.

5. A collection raised £3.50.
