Battersea and Wandsworth Trades Council Anti-Fascist Committee

Reference to Papers 69/198

1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

2. A meeting was held by the Battersea and Wandsworth Trades Council Anti-Fascist Committee on Tuesday 11 November 1975 at 172 Lavender Hill, SW11, the offices of Wandsworth Council for Community Relations (WOCR). The meeting, which began at 7.30pm and ended at 9.30pm, was attended by five members.

3. The first item on the agenda was the question of a replacement for [Privacy] as the Committee's convenor to the Trades Council. The only suitable candidate was [Privacy] a member of the Trades Council Executive Committee, who was duly proposed and seconded.

4. The proposed National Front meeting at Battersea Lower Town Hall on November 19th was then discussed. [Privacy] announced that the booking of the hall had been cancelled but that it was possible that members of the National Front would picket the hall in protest against the decision. It was decided that each person present should attend the venue on November 19th together with at least four other persons, in case this was the position."
