1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

2. "On Thursday, 31st January 1980, between 8 and 10 pm, at the Hackney Trades and Labour Club, Dalston Lane, E8, the Stoke Newington Branch of the Socialist Workers Party held a meeting at which approximately twelve persons attended.

Reference to Papers

3. The meeting was called to discuss 'Bennism' and 'Left Reformism' within the Labour Party. The speaker, [Privacy], briefly outlined the discussion that took place at Party Conference on these subjects. His speech included the following statement; 'The growth of left reformism offers the Party opportunities, insofar as it offers a wider audience for all left-wing ideas. At the same time, however, it can also make it more difficult for the Party to attract people directly to ourselves, since Bennism will often seem to be a much more realistic alternative than ourselves.' [Privacy] felt that if Benn came to power it would be too unrealistic to visualize the SWP aligning itself with the Labour Party. Nothing further of interest emerged from the meeting."
