Reference to Papers

1. Box 500 in their letter [redacted] of the 3rd September 1981 refer to [redacted] Male name [redacted] and the attack on the [redacted] office in [redacted] on the [redacted] of the [redacted] and ask if Special Branch can provide information regarding his possible involvement in the "Proletarian Offensive".

2. Information has now been received from a reliable source that the known activities of [redacted] Male name [redacted] have centred on three areas: [redacted] [redacted] and his presence as a principal comrade at the 121 Anarchist Bookshop, Railton Road, SE24.

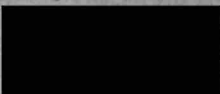
3. Although his precise activities between [redacted] and his emergence as a member of the "Proletarian Offensive" [redacted] are not known with certainty, Male name [redacted] is thought to have made early contact at this time with [redacted] Privacy [redacted] and possibly others in the Brixton area and to have shown a particular interest in the setting up of the 121 Bookshop. There is no information to suggest any other intervening activity.

4. The subject was prominent at [redacted] and at this time became closely acquainted with [redacted] Privacy [redacted] of Freedom Collective, whom he has frequently visited in Pentonville Prison [redacted]. The attack [redacted] constitutes the sole action of the "Proletarian Offensive" and [redacted] Privacy [redacted] has stated that on that occasion the subject's courage almost failed him.

5. The foundation of the 121 Bookshop, with the catalyst provided by the Brixton riots, has given Male name [redacted] his greatest motivation in recent months. In response to a request from [redacted] he gave a talk [redacted] on the riots and intends to organise a national conference on the subject of the riots [redacted] should sufficient support be forthcoming. He was a participant in the Brixton disturbances of 11th - 12th April 1981.

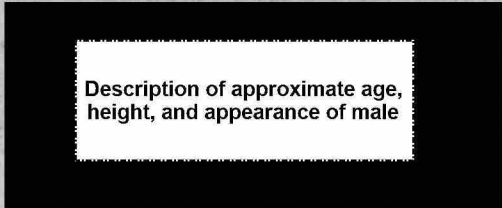
