SUBJECT Britain-Vietnam Solidarity Front.

11th day of September, 1969.

Between 7.30 p.m. and 8.50 p.m. today, in company with Detective Constable [redacted], I was present at Portland Hall, Little Titchfield Street, W.1. where a meeting was held under the auspices of the 'BRITAIN-VIETNAM SOLIDARITY FRONT', to pay tribute to the late Ho Chi Minh. The meeting, which was orderly throughout, was attended by about sixty persons.

2. Over the speakers platform was a large coloured portrait of Ho Chi Minh suitably draped in black and flanked by two large vases of flowers. Around the hall were hung pictures of Marx, Lenin, Stalin and Mao Tse Tung. In addition, there were posters bearing the following slogans:-

'Eternal Glory to Great Leader-Ho Chi Minh'
'Britain-Vietnam Solidarity Front'
'Victory to the N.L.F.'
'Workers of all countries Unite'

3. Before the commencement of the speeches, recordings were played of the North Vietnamese National Anthem and a reading of the last will and testament of Ho Chi Minh.

4. The chairman of the meeting was Abhimanyu MANCHANDA and other speakers were:-


In addition, sang a revolutionary song in praise of Ho Chi Minh at the conclusion of the meeting.

5. All the speakers contributed their piece to an eulogy of Ho Chi Minh, describing him as the greatest revolutionary of all time, the world's greatest patriot and a devoted supporter of all people who were attempting to throw off the shackles of both American and Soviet imperialism. After the main speakers, two coloured men, the names of whom were not given but were said to represent the 'PAN AFRICANIST CONGRESS' and 'Z.A.P.U.', spoke from the floor and stated that the example set by Ho Chi Minh had been of the greatest encouragement to all African people who were fighting for their freedom. An unidentified Irishman (representing the 'IRISH IN EXILE ASSOCIATION') also claimed that Ho Chi Minh's


fighting spirit had greatly encouraged Irishmen in Belfast and Derry in their fight for freedom from British oppression.

6. During the meeting it was announced by Norman TEMPLE that on 3rd October, 1969, a meeting was to be held at Conway Hall, Red Lion Square, W.C.1. in support of the Palestinians.


