The following information has been received from a reliable MONETON SH

"On Friday, 5 January 1979, between 7.30pm and 10.15pm at Correcty Hall (Small Hall), Red Lion Square, WCt, the London District of the Nevelutionary Communist League of Britain (BCLE) held the third and final public meeting in the ourrent series on Chairman Mac Te: Pung's 'Theory of the Three Worlds'. The advertised topic for discussion was 'Three World Theory and the Strategy for Revolution in Britain' and approximately 15 persons attendet.


The meeting was chaired by Elider Jonathan KING and addressed by Chris BURFORD, the Chairman of the Central Committee of the BULB, and Communde 'Reith' of the Communist workers' Movement (CMM). KING told of the struggle to rebuild the party of the working class in Britain and claimed that the 'Three World Theory' was fundamental to the understanding of international socialist. Be maffirmed the dangers of 'Soviet Social Imperialism', regarded by the RCLD as being the main threat to the stability of the Vorle.

In contrast, the speech delivered by BURFORD soon developed into a personal attack on rival figures in the Marrist-Leminist movement, notably Beg RIRCH (Communist Party of Britain - ML). Godfrey CHEPCER (As ociation of Communist Vorkers), Ivor KERNA (Firshary Communist Association) and Albert MANCHANDA (Revolutionary Parxist-Leningst Communist Lengue). BIRCH and CHREST were not present but it was observed that both KERTA and MARCHARDA were clearly curprised at the ferocity of the attack (in the past, although disagreements have been discussed publicly, they have enjoyed a certain immunity from criticism, perhaps in the mistaken belief that they, as well as CHREFF and others, would be encouraged to affiliate to the RCLB). However, the 'hard line' had most certainly been set by BURFORD; as far as he was concerned, it was not to be a bourgeois desporatio seeting but a prolification democratic one and he declared that he would choose the speakers. To make his point clear he posed the question , "Who do these people represent?" and then remarked that, to his knowledge, the Association of Communist Vorkers had six members, the Pinsbury Communist Association comprised one man, his wife and a typowriter, whilst there were more words in the title of MANCHANNA's organisation Chara substitutes.

- 5. These remarks were not challenged and had the desired affect of hamiliating their victims. Later, however, the meeting was opened to contributions from the audience, it was left to the Spartdeists that evangelical style Trotakyist group to attack the RCLB.
- 6. The bolimos was adequately redressed afterwards by the orehestrated contributions of the BCLB members and supporters.
- 7. The final address by Comrade 'Reith' was well researched but poorly presented and instantly forgettable. The meeting was then brought to a close with the amnouncement by KING that the RULB would be holding another public meeting on Saturday 3 February 1979".
