

NOTE FOR Liaison file

1. On 28 July 1982 I visited SDS for a meeting with HN68 before my leave period. David Short is away until 16 August 1982. I told HN68 in my absence [REDACTED] would be his contact in F6.
2. HN68 mentioned that he was aware of not yet having met our recent briefs on SWP and my request for information on the relationship between Peace News, London Peace Action and Greenpeace.
3. I gave HN68 F7 [REDACTED] brief as at [REDACTED] and mentioned the subject of F3 [REDACTED] letter at [REDACTED].
4. HN68 asked whether we received regular copies of the Anti Apartheid League newspaper. [REDACTED]
5. Despite his misdemeanours, COOPER has not been withdrawn as an SDS source. He claimed that he was acting on the advice of his solicitors in not making maintenance payments. HN68 is still very worried by the case because COOPER's position in the Right to Work Movement gives him regular access to Ernie ROBERTS MP and meetings at the House of Commons.
6. Tony WILLIAMS is being withdrawn from 1 August 1982 and will not be replaced immediately. HN68 did not consider this to be a great loss as WILLIAMS had not been a particularly productive source.
7. There are now more potential SDS sources in the pipeline. I will ask for further details after the holiday period.
