The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

"On Thursday 9 April 1970, between 8 pm and 10 pm at the basement flat of [redacted] Privacy, SW1, an inaugural meeting of the Westminster Branch of the Britain Tricontinental Organisation was held. The chairman was [redacted] Privacy and three other persons were present.

Apologies for absence were received from [redacted] Privacy, [redacted] Privacy and [redacted] Privacy. It was decided that because these members were absent, the election of officers would be postponed until the next meeting.

They discussed the recent cases in the East End of London, where Pakistanis had been beaten up by the so-called "bovver boys". They thought that the best way to tackle the problem would be to have vigilante groups to select a few "skinheads" and assault them. Attempts were to be made to contact [redacted] Privacy of the Pakistani Workers' Union, and members were asked to attend the founding meeting of the Socialist Alliance Against Racism. [redacted] Privacy said that she wanted to see a crisis caused in the East End, and expressed willingness to teach karate to the Branch, so that they would be able to defend themselves.

[redacted] Privacy stated that she knew how to make "molotov cocktails", and that she would not hesitate to use them. She thought that the best sort were those in small beer bottles, as they caused a lot of noise and not much damage.

Mention was made of the proposed sit-in at the Greek Tourist Office on Tuesday 21 April (SB report of 3 March 1970 on 400/67/87 refers) and [redacted] Privacy told the meeting that he expected it to go ahead, although he had been unable to contact [redacted] Privacy. [redacted] Privacy recommended that leaflets be inserted in the travel brochures in the Greek Tourist Office condemning the military junta, and that "stink-bombs" and "smoke bombs" be dropped.
