SUBJECT

1. The following information has been received from a reliable source:-

2. "On Monday, 18th June 1979, at 7pm, at [Privacy] W3 (the home of [Privacy], the North-West London District of the Socialist Workers Party held a Committee meeting under the chairmanship of [Privacy]. About nine persons attended.

Reference to Papers

3. Proceedings began with a summary from [Privacy] of the preparations for the Rank and File Trade Union Conference being held in Manchester on 23rd June, 1979. A special train had been booked to take delegates from London, leaving Euston Station at 7.30am. It was disclosed that about 560 application forms had been received from the country as a whole and it was hoped that, by the date of the conference, a total of at least 600 delegates would attend.

4. Afterwards it was mentioned that the Anti-Nazi League National Conference would be held on 14th July 1979 at the Central London Polytechnic.

5. Referring to the Right to Work Campaign, [Privacy] emphasised that a great effort had to be made over the next two months to involve schoolchildren, students and the unemployed in this campaign prior to the Right to Work March from Liverpool to Blackpool in September (the march is to lobby the Trade Union Conference taking place in Blackpool at that time).

6. Before the meeting closed, it was announced that the National Front were holding a march this Saturday (23rd June) against the 'Vietnamese Boat People' and the British Movement were demonstrating against the 'reds in British politics' on the same day. The ANL were calling for a London and South-East Counties mobilisation for both these events, assembling at 1.30pm in Leicester Square, WC2. It was agreed that the NW London SWP would meet outside Kilburn Underground Station at 12 noon and travel to the area as a group."
